Reminders

Please I can remind all parents that children should only have water in their water bottle everyday (and not juice). Bottles should also be brought home daily to be washed and refilled ready for the next day. We have also noticed an increase in the number of children bringing fruit substitute snacks to school (e.g. fruit winders). Our policy is that children are provided with a fresh piece of fruit or vegetable as a snack daily and that the substitute fruit products are not given to the children for their mid morning snack. Laptops

In March this year, we held a sponsored bounce to raise money to purchase new laptops. Unfortunately, two weeks after the fundraiser, we went into lockdown and were unable to proceed with our plans for purchasing these. The cost of the laptops increased dramatically due to the fact that they come from China and we therefore decided to wait for the prices to become more affordable. I am thrilled however to let you know that we have recently purchased 16 new laptops which were mainly funded with the sponsored bounce money and an incredibly generous donation from the Friends of Watton. These are now available for the children to use and are a fantastic addition to the schools IT resources. We do still need to purchase more of these however, so that we have a trolley of laptops available for each key stage. This will provide more opportunities for all of the children to use ICT across the curriculum.

Remote Learning

If your child is self isolating and waiting the results of a COVID 19 test or your child has had a positive COVID 19 test result and so therefore also self isolating, we have class work prepared and uploaded to the website so the impact on your children's learning is minimized.

Teachers have prepared a daily maths, English and topic activity which is in line with what learning is happening in class. Don't forget also that the children will have homework to complete, daily reading and access to any Purple Mash activities. KS2 children also have access to Times Table Rock Stars. Reading Plus

As a school we have invested into an online reading programme called Reading Plus and currently the Year 5 children have access to this reading platform.

Every week, I check in with the year 5 teachers to find out how the children are getting on with the reading tasks and to monitor the frequency that the children are using it and how much progress they are making.

Internet Safety

Our advice with regards to age restrictions is that it's always better to wait until the required age to join any social media service. These rules around age relate to privacy, but also are relevant to safety. Some services offer additional protection for users who are registered as under 18, and by supplying a fake age young people can potentially lose some of this protection. Young people also risk being exposed to content which is intended for older users when they use sites that are not designed for people their age.

Additionally, if a service finds out a user is underage then they may delete the user's account and any content which has been shared.

We know that social media services are popular with young people of all ages. Parents have an important role in helping prepare their children to go online before they start to use social media platforms. Together you can look at the key things they need to know about staying safe online, critical thinking, and the safety settings that are available to them.



Instagram (13+)

When you set up your account, it is automatically set as public. To change your profile to private (so only people you approve can follow you) go to your profile, tap Settings, tap Account Privacy and tap to toggle Private Account on.

Remove a follower: Go to your profile and tap followers, tap to the right of the person and select remove.

Blocking: If you want to stop somebody from liking or commenting on your posts, you can block them. To do this, tap their username, tap on the 3 circles in the top right and select block.

Turn off commenting on a post: Tap above your post, select Turn Off Commenting.

WhatsApp (16+)

By default, WhatsApp sets your privacy settings to allow any WhatsApp user to see your read receipts, last seen, about and profile photo.

To change any of these settings, go to settings, account and privacy.

Reporting: When you receive a message from an unknown number for the first time, you will be given the option to report the number. This report will then send the most recent messages in the chat to WhatsApp. You can also report any issues direct to WhatsApp within the app by going to settings, help and contact us.

Facebook (13+)

Included in Facebook's setting are the ability to set who can see your posts, who can contact you and the ability to review all posts before appearing on your timeline (Timeline Review).

Unfriend: go to their profile, hover over Friends and select Unfriend.

Blocking: If you don't want somebody to add you as a friend or send you a message then block them. Select Settings & Privacy and then settings, click Blocking and enter the name of the person, click Block, select the correct person and click block and block.



Parents and Carers requiring to self-isolate

If you are a parent or carer and have been asked to self-isolate as part of a bubble at work or because you have come into close contact with someone who has tested positive for coronavirus – you must follow the national self-isolation guidance and stay at home for 14 days: www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/self-isolation-and-treatment/how-long-to-self-isolate/

- This applies even if you have no symptoms and/or you have received a negative test result as it can take 14 days for transmission
- Self-isolation rules do not apply to the rest of your household, they can still attend work or school and complete day to day tasks in line with Government guidance
- If you develop symptoms while self-isolating, your entire household must begin self-isolating immediately
- If you would normally travel with your child(ren) to nursery, school or college, alternative arrangements should be made
- If you cannot make alternative travel arrangements for your child(ren), then they too must stay at home. Please contact your school or education setting directly for advice on remote learning in this situation

Please do not send child(ren) to school if they have any symptoms of coronavirus. If you're not sure, consult the online NHS symptom checker at: www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/
