Dear Parents and Carers,

I do hope that both you and your families enjoyed your half term break and that you had the chance to relax and have some well-deserved time away from the pressures of remote learning. We know how challenging the last half term has been for everyone in the school community and even though it was a short half term, I know that everyone was very glad to make it to the end.

You would have all heard in the news on Monday evening, where Boris Johnson announced that all children will be returning to school on Monday 8th March. This week, I have written to you a detailed letter outlining the return for children to school and practical as well as health and safety considerations which have been made to ensure that school is as safe as it possibly can be. We are all very excited about some normality being resumed again. I would like to thank you all personally for your hard work and support during this term. I know that this was no easy challenge for you all and I'm sure you will be thrilled that there is only one more week of remote learning left!!!

If, in the event of your child needing to self-isolate following a positive COVID test or that someone in your household tests positive, then the school will still be providing remote learning for them to complete. This won't be live Zoom lessons, but the work set will be in line with what the children in class will be doing. Walk, Run, Cycle Class Competition

For the last 2 weeks prior to the end of the half term, I set a whole school challenge for all the children to get involved in. The initial challenge started off as a walk, run and cycle challenge but this developed over the 2 weeks and you and your children were logging a vast array of different physical activities that they were completing. The challenge was started during Children's Mental Health Week as we know that physical exercise has a huge potential to enhance our wellbeing. Just short bursts of exercise increases our mental awareness, energy and positive mood as well as increasing self-esteem and reducing stress and anxiety.

Results

- 636 entries were logged over the 2 week period
- 312 entries were for children walking, 70 entries for cycling and 46 entries for running
- Yoga, football, dancing, scootering, workouts, trampolining and weights were also some of the most popular forms of exercise.
- 161 of the entries was for exercising for an hour and 139 entries was for exercising between 21 and 30 minutes.

So who were the most active overall?

Well done and congratulation to Year 6 with 171 entries.

Also congratulations to Year 4 (112 entries), Nursery (74 entries), Year 2 (64 entries), Year 5 Wonders (61 entries) and Reception (58 entries).

The top 30 active children were all sent certificates home in the half term holiday in recognition of how active they were during the competition. Well done to everyone who took part. Remember to keep being active during the next couple of weeks.


