Children loved the fact that they were able to choose their own rules to break (with the guidance from the class teachers) and many of them broke multiple rules!!












House Point Winners Half Termly Reward

Dance performances

This half term, Years 1 - 5 (year 6 will be having their dance lessons after half term) have been having dance lessons weekly and this week we finished this unit of PE with dance performances within the phase bubbles.

On Monday this week, Year 4 performed three separate dances based on their topic of the Celts. Their dances were based around Celt battles, making bread and Celtic spirals.

On Wednesday, the Year 5 classes performed their dances to each other. Beckams split into small groups to develop their own dance moves which they put to the song Happy by Pharrell Williams. They then danced to an instrumental version of Bad Guy by Billie Eilish which had a very different tone to Happy. The children kept the same movements but changed the way that they performed them so that they would fit the new song. Wonders danced to 'Proud Mary'. They worked in groups of their choosing of 2-6 children, choreographing their own routines! This involved great team work, finding and keeping rhythm and beat within the changing sections.

On Thursday, Year 3 performed their dance to the Year 4 children. They performed their dances in pairs and choreographed their own movements to 'Footloose'.

Year 2 also performed their class dance to a sea shanty. Each child thought of a movement that they wanted to include somewhere in the dance and then all the movements were combined to create a finished dance which reflected all of the children's ideas.

Year 1 worked in groups to come up with their dance moves which were then combined to make the final dance. They performed their dance to an instrumental track 'Back to Christmas Day'.









Birthday celebrations

Wishing all the children who have celebrated their birthday this week or are looking forward to their birthday in the half term holiday a very happy birthday.






