Exiting restrictions - plan for September

As the country moves to step 4 of the roadmap for exiting lockdown restrictions, we too will also be making some changes to the running and organisation of the school. We have followed the DFE guidance alongside our own risk assessment to ensure that we exit our restrictions as safely as possible for both children, staff and parents on site.

From September, we will no longer be having a staggered start and finish to the school day. The gates will be open from 8.45am and children will be allowed to go straight to their classrooms. The gates will be closed at 8.55am, which is when the class registers are taken. If your child arrives after 8.55am, then please go to the admin office so that your child can be signed in. If you arrive before the gates are open, then please continue to socially distance yourselves the best that you can. The school day will finish at 3.15pm and children will need to be collected from the same places you dropped off at in the morning. Children moving into our Nursery and Reception classes will use the green Nursery gate, children moving into Year 6 will use the dining hall door and all other year groups will use the main gate by the admin office. This will minimise congestion at the main gate.

Whereas children will still be mainly working within their class bubbles inside the school, there will no longer be zones on the playground or field and children will be allowed to mix with other children from other bubbles. Whilst eating their lunch, children will be sitting inside with other children within their phase bubble only.

We are currently delivering all our assemblies virtually, but in the autumn term, we plan to deliver face-to-face assemblies with children in their phase bubbles (as opposed to the whole school in the hall) and the Friday celebration assembly will still be held virtually until we feel that it is safe enough to make further changes.

We will continue to ensure that there are still good hygiene procedures in school and will continue to encourage regular handwashing, use of hand sanitiser, well ventilated classrooms (whilst maintaining a comfortable temperature) and a thorough cleaning schedule which includes the cleaning of equipment and areas prone to being touched.

The staff in school will continue to test themselves twice per week as we recognise that this is still vitally important in reducing the risk of transmission of infection. We will also continue to send home children should they develop any of the symptoms of COVID, however mild, so that they can follow public health advice.

Last Day of Term - Wednesday 21st July

Normally on the last day of term, school would close at 2.15pm for all children. However, we have had to make some changes to this arrangement for the end of this term due to the staggered finishes. Children in Reception, Year 1, 2 and 4 will need to be collected between 2pm and 2.20pm and children in Pre school, Nursery, 3, 5, 6 will need to be collected between 2.20pm and 2.40pm. Thank you.

New household account feature for parents reporting test results

NHS Test and Trace are continuing to develop and improve the process for self-test reporting. Currently, if a parent is submitting results through their account on behalf of a child, they have to enter the child's details every time they report a result.

As a result of feedback from parents, NHS Test and Trace have introduced household accounts. This allows parents to save their children's details to their own user accounts so parents can report results for multiple members in the household more quickly and easily. When reporting self-test results parents will now be offered the opportunity to create a household account, which should take no more than 2 minutes. Parents can then add all household members to their account, enabling them to save time when reporting all future self-test results.

Pencil Cases

This year the children in Years 1 - 6 have brought their own pencil cases to school and they have really enjoyed having their own equipment to use. This has also taught them skills of responsibility for looking after their own resources. As we move into the new school year, we will be happy for children to bring in their own pencil cases and contents again. School will provide writing pencils and pens (for those who have a pen licence) but all other equipment can be their own. Please don't send any felt tip pens into school as these have a tendency to leak and children don't use these in their work books either.

P.E Kíts

Like many other schools, we decided that following the return to school after the school closure, the children would come to school in their PE kit on the days that they had P.E lessons, rather than changing into their P.E kits in school.

There have been so many positive benefits (for both parents and children) to having children come into school in their P.E kits on the days that they have P.E, that we will be continuing with this practice when the children return to school in the autumn term. However, we would like parents to ensure that the children are wearing the correct P.E kits, including correct colour and items of P.E kit so that the children are just as smart in school whether the children are in school uniform or their P.E kits. 
Nursery awards
