To our families and friends,

As we come to the end of the first half of the spring term, I wanted to reflect on all of the amazing events that have taken place. It certainly has been a very busy and exciting time in school.

January was off to a great start with a brand new School Vision which was written following several months of work and consulting with the whole school community. We are now working on designing the artwork for our school vision displays to be placed around the school.

Despite the inclement weather, the children all started off the year by enjoying a Caribbean-themed International Week. Each class focused on a different Caribbean island, learning about local foods, flags and all about their culture. The children had a performance from a real live steel band in our assembly. Children in Years 1 - 6 also had the opportunity to play the steel pans and create some simple tunes and rhythms.

Year 4 went to Wodson Park for a P.E. Developmental Day where they learned Bollywood dancing, indoor bowls and Boccia (a Paralympic sport similar to indoor bowls).

At the end of January, we organised for the children to have an amazing day of science when we arranged for a company called Fab Science to come into school. Those in Years 3-6 were able to take part in a hands-on "Potty Potions" science workshop, while those in Years 1-2 enjoyed a science assembly workshop.

Year 5 went on their class trip to the British Museum in Hitchin where they took part in reading, writing and arithmetic lessons in an authentic classroom setting - with a very strict teacher from the museum. They also enjoyed a drill/PE session in the yard.

Year 6 and some children in Year 5 went to Wodson Park for a Sportshall competition against other local schools. We were thrilled that our boys' team came first overall and our girls' team came third overall. All of the children returned to school with their medals and were extremely proud of their achievements.

To round off this half term, the children took part in this year's Safer Internet Day and all classes had an age-appropriate lesson with their teacher to help them to learn to enjoy navigating the online world safely.

The final workshop of this half term was for Year 2 who welcomed the Bubble Theatre Company for a Great Fire of London workshop on Tuesday this week for their fantastic finish to their topic. The children were able to sing songs, play games and act out the story of events from 1666. They played the parts of significant characters such as King Charles II, Sir Christopher Wren, Samuel Pepys and Thomas Farrier.

It was wonderful to see so many parents come into school this week to meet up with the class teachers and look through your children's books. I hope that you are feeling well informed about your child's progress and attainment at this point in the year.

Today we finished the half term with 'No pens day'. Children got to put down their pencils and pens and engage in lots of other learning styles and activities across the curriculum. Internet Safety

A quick background on County Lines...

County lines refers to the practice of criminal gangs from urban areas exploiting vulnerable children and young people to transport and sell drugs in rural or coastal areas. This puts these children at risk of being drawn into a dangerous and criminal lifestyle.

Children involved in county lines may face violence and abuse from both gang members and rival groups, even when not part of any gangs themselves (outside of being exploited). This can have a severe impact on their physical and mental well-being, often leading to truancy and disengagement from education, as children are coerced into prioritising drug activities over their studies. This can have long-term consequences for their future prospects.

It is crucial to raise awareness about the risks associated with county lines and to provide support and intervention for children who may be vulnerable to exploitation...
