

As a parent or carer you play a key role in helping your child to stay safe online.

You don't need to be an expert on the internet to help keep your child stay safe online.

There is lots of advice and resources available to support you as you help your child to use the internet safely, responsibility and positively.

Today, I have attached a fantastic and easily accessible booklet called 'Young Children and Screen Time - a good start' which covers the following key pieces of guidance:

1. Use digital devices together with your child

2. Think through the rules you want to set for media and technology use at home

3. Learn more about services, content, technology and age ratings

4. Teach children good internet habits early on - you are their most important role model. With the Christmas holidays approaching and no doubt lots of technology being purchased as Christmas presents, what better time to be prepared to help your child with their online safety.

Our school values are at the HEART of everything we believe in. In December the school value we are focusing on is Resilience.
