On Tuesday, Mike Mullen (a former world BMX champion) inspired, excited and enthralled the children and staff with his messages about resilience, determination, perseverance and having a growth mindset. He spoke to the children about Flearn (failures helps us to learn) and encouraged children to look for 'open doors' to learn new challenges as opposed to going straight to the 'closed door' when a challenge faces them. The Year 5 and 6 children also got to practice these life skills whilst learning some new BMX tricks. Didn't they do well!! Look on our new Facebook page to see Mike performing one of his jumps.

Anti Bullying

This week we have been reminding the children that bullying is defined as "repeated and intended to hurt someone either physically or emotionally. It takes many forms and can include physical assault, teasing, making threats, name calling, cyberbullying - bullying via mobile phone or online".

The children have recently completed a questionnaire about bullying and I wanted to share the results with you.

Do you know what bullying is? 95% of children had a very good understanding.

How friendly are the children at our school? 98% of children said that children are friendly or very friendly.

Do you feel safe in school? 90% of children said that they felt safe or very safe.

Do you think bullying is tolerated in this school? 99.5% said that it wasn't tolerated.

Do adults deal with bullying straight away? 50% said that bullying was dealt with immediately.

What would you do if you saw someone else being bullied? 100% of the children said that they would tell an adult and tell the bully to stop.

These results overall were very positive, yet we can see that we need to ensure that all members of staff are addressing bullying immediately. Staff have already spoken to children who said that they don't feel safe in school to understand further when this might be happening and to action swiftly.

Attendance this week: Attendance for this week is 97.2%

Attendance overall: For the whole of the academic school year attendance is 96.4%

Behaviour

In September 2019, we launched a new behaviour system called 'Good to be Green' and 'Great to be Gold'. As a school we have been closely monitoring the effectiveness of this new system whilst ensuring that high standards are being expected from the children by all staff and that the children are fully aware of the rewards for good behaviour choices as well as the consequences for poor behaviour choices. I am pleased to inform you that we have seen great impact from this new system and that the number of red cards at this point in the year has reduced dramatically since September.

September 31 red cards
October 17 red cards
November 22 red cards
December 12 red cards
January 11 red cards
February 11 red cards

We have recently made a few changes to what behaviours would see a stop and think, red and yellow card being given (as requested by the children in their pupil parliament meetings) and have displayed these posters around the school which will help poor behaviour choices being dealt with fairly and effectively by all staff. We have attached a copy for your reference too so that you can have discussions at home with your child should this be necessary.


Parking in Rectory Lane

Again, I have been contacted by a resident who lives in Rectory Lane to complain that parents are being inconsiderate and parking across their driveway. They have also complained about parents being rude to them when they have been asked to move their car. I have advised the parent to take a photo of car registration plates of the offending vehicles and send the photos to the Highway agency. They will be able to contact the DVLA to get your details and will contact you directly about parking illegally over people's driveways. Please stop and think before you park your cars. I have also asked Mr. Starkey our site manager to patrol the road before and after school.



Online Safety

This week we put the spotlight on TikTok What is TikTok?

Users can watch musical clips, record (up to) 60 second clips, edit them and add special effects.

Is your child old enough?

You must be over 13 years of age to use TikTok.

Why should I be concerned?

Some of the songs used in this app may contain explicit language and sexual imagery, which may not be suitable for your child to view. If your child is using TikTok then we recommend setting the account as private. Did you know?

Even with a private account, your child's profile information such as their photo and bio is still visible so ensure your child understands the importance of not adding personal information (e.g. address, age and phone numbers).
