Neurodiversity Assemblies

This week we had 2 visitors to school (Pippa from the charity ADD-vance and Sophia from SEND) who came to talk to the children about 'Neurodiversity'. Neurodiversity means that brain differences are just that: differences. So conditions like ADHD and autism aren't "abnormal." They're simply variations of the human brain.

For children with learning and thinking differences, the idea of neurodiversity has real benefits. It can help children (and their parents) frame their challenges as differences, rather than as deficits. It can also shed light on instructional approaches that might help to highlight particular strengths children have. I would like to thank Mr Mehmet for organising both of these assemblies for us and proud to say that we are the first school that Pippa was aware of in Hertfordshire to be celebrating neurodiversity week.

Homework

If such an improvement does not occur then the Educational Welfare Officer will be informed.



Online Safety

This week we put the spotlight on Whatsapp.

You must be at least 16 years old to register for and use WhatsApp.

WhatsApp is a free messaging app that allows you to send messages and videos. WhatsApp has a Group chat function which allows up to 256 people to be added. Groups are set up by one person (who is the admin) and everybody in the group, even if they're not one of your child's phone contacts will be able to see all messages sent. If your child is added to a group with someone they have previously blocked, that person can still see their messages and send them messages through the group.

WhatsApp has been used in instances of online bullying, for example sending nasty messages or sharing images of other children without their permission in order to embarrass them.

WhatsApp does offer the ability to block and report contacts.

Next week we explore Instagram and give you some guidance to ensure your children stay safe online.
