No pens Day

This Tuesday, we had our half termly no pens day. The children engaged in exciting and varied activities across the curriculum where there were lots of opportunities to talk and encourage children's communication skills.

Of all the skills we develop at school, the ability to communicate effectively is the one that has the most profound and potentially positive impact on our lives. Communication is at the core of what we do: at home, in work, at school and socially. Good spoken language skills are strong predictors of later academic success. Children with poor language and literacy development at 5 are at substantial risk of low achievement at 7 and beyond. Take a look at our 'No Pen's Gallery' in this weeks newsletter.

Christmas arrangements

This year, there will be some changes to the normal Christmas arrangements due to COVID-19. We really want to keep the fun and festivities as much as possible for the children but due to needing to maintain in bubbles this year, this will affect many of our normal arrangements.

<u>Class Christmas assemblies</u> Instead of performances that parents, carers and families normally come into school to watch, we are planning this year on each class in KS1 and 2 having a Christmas class assembly which will be recorded and made available for you to watch before the end of term. The children in Preschool will be singing some Christmas songs and children in Nursery and Reception will be taking part in a Nativity tableau. More details to follow.

<u>Pantomime trip</u> As we can't go to the theatre this year, we will be treating the whole school to an online pantomime instead. Children in the Early Years will be watching 'Search for Santa' and children in KS1 and KS2 will be watching 'Aladdin'. There will be no cost implication for parents and carers as we plan to fund both of these pantomimes with the money raised in the recent 'Break the Rules Day' fundraiser.

<u>Christmas cards</u> Each class will be having their own Christmas card collection boxes. Children can bring Christmas cards in for other children and staff <u>in their own class only</u> during one allocated week (7^{th} - 11^{th} December) and these cards will remain quarantined in the box until Monday 14^{th} December. Please don't bring cards into school after 11^{th} December. During the last few days of term, cards will be sorted and handed out to the children. They won't be allowed to open them in school.

<u>Class parties</u> Class teachers will be organizing their own small class parties this year in their classrooms. Unfortunately, children won't be able to share communal party food. Teachers will be sending more details out towards the end of term.

Pupil Parliament

In the week leading up to half term, we held our first pupil parliament meeting of this academic year. Organised in a different way so that we didn't burst the bubbles, all the children in the school had the opportunity to voice their views and opinions about the COVID changes to the school this term (lunchtime arrangements indoors and outdoors, social distancing and future fundraising ideas). All teachers took minutes of the meetings held and these have now been collated and discussed.

In light of the suggestions made by the children, we are now in the process of increasing the variety of outdoor equipment the children can play with in their bubbles and we have produced a rota so that all KS1 and KS2 children have a fair opportunity to use the boat/bus or trim trail too at playtimes and lunchtimes. The equipment will be in quarantine over the weekend (48 hours) before the new classes use the equipment the following week. Classes were also very forthcoming with their ideas and suggestions about future possible fundraising events and who we should be fundraising for. Several classes raised the issue about people being homeless and so we have decided that our Christmas jumper day (16th December) will be an opportunity to raise money to support homeless people locally over the Christmas period.,

Parents and Carers requiring to self-isolate

If you are a parent or carer and have been asked to self-isolate as part of a bubble at work or because you have come into close contact with someone who has tested positive for coronavirus - you must follow the national self-isolation guidance and stay at home for 14 days: www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/self-isolation-and-treatment/how-long-to-self-isolate/

- This applies even if you have no symptoms and/or you have received a negative test result as it can take 14 days for transmission
- Self-isolation rules do not apply to the rest of your household, they can still attend work or school and complete day to day tasks in line with Government guidance
- If you develop symptoms while self-isolating, your entire household must begin selfisolating immediately
- If you would normally travel with your child(ren) to nursery, school or college, alternative arrangements should be made
- If you cannot make alternative travel arrangements for your child(ren), then they too must stay at home. Please contact your school or education setting directly for advice on remote learning in this situation
