Christmas Bubbles

You should not meet socially with friends and family in your home or garden unless they are part of your Christmas bubble. We just wanted to say a big thank you to everyone who has contributed to the FOW fundraisers this term, we have raised over £1000, which is amazing considering the situation.



Reporting Positive COVID 19 Cases in the Christmas holiday

As you may have seen in the news, the government have asked that schools monitor any cases of COVID-19 in the school community during the Christmas holidays.

If a pupil or staff member tests positive for COVID-19 having developed symptoms within 48 hours of finishing at school (up until Saturday 19th December) then the school should be contacted so that close contacts can be made aware of the need to self-isolate.

Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, the school should not be contacted. Parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

For the first 6 days after teaching ends (ie: until 23rd December), if a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, the school is asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school.

Where pupils are required to self-isolate due to contact with a positive case after the first 6 days following the end of term, schools do not need to be informed about their absence until Monday 4th January.

Please alert us of any confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 in the children or staff via the below email ONLY. This is the only email address that will be monitored during the Christmas holidays: Covid19@wattonatstone.herts.sch.uk

If we are alerted to a case of COVID-19, the close contacts of the case will be advised by letter to self-isolate for 14 days from either the first day of symptoms, or if asymptomatic, 48 hours before the test, with this being day 0.




