Exiting lockdown Restrictions

Dear Parents and Carers,

Following the Prime Ministers announcement on Monday that the country won't be in a position to end the current lockdown on 21st June, we too, as a school, will need to maintain our current protective measures in place for the rest of this term. We had hoped that in the next few weeks that we too would be able to continue with our plans to exit the current lockdown restrictions so that by the end of the term the school resembled more normality and this will be disappointing for all of the school community to hear.

We had also hoped to be in a position to open the school up more to parents and carers and welcome you on site for various planned functions and events. One of these events we had hoped to be in a position to invite you to, was the planned sports day on 6th July. Unfortunately, with the extended lockdown period, we won't be able to now go ahead with this plan. I understand how disappointing this will be for you but with the Delta variant of the COVID virus spreading so rapidly both locally and nationally, I have no other choice than to continue to do all I can to protect everyone in the school community. I have looked again at our risk assessment and don't believe that we can welcome parents safely without increasing the risks. The sports day will still go ahead for the children as planned and we will endeavour to do all we can to make this a wonderful and memorable day for them.

Here are the inspirational people that the teachers have chosen:

Pre-school: <u>Marcus Rashford.</u> Footballer and campaigner against homelessness and child hunger in the UK.

Nursery: <u>Malala Yousafzai.</u> She spoke out publically about girl's rights to learn and have an education in Pakistan.

Reception: <u>Hannah Fry.</u> She is a Prof of Mathematics, has written books and presented TV programmes based around Maths...and she attended Presdales School.

Year 1: <u>Usain Bolt</u>. With sports day in a couple of weeks, the children will be inspired by this athlete.

Year 2: <u>Jane Goodall</u>. In science, we are learning about Living Things and their Habitats. Jane studied chimpanzees in particular and is an expert in this field. She dedicated her life to the study and protection of chimpanzees.

Year 3: <u>Dick King Smith</u>. An inspirational author who used to be a teacher and has really engaged the Year 3 children with their writing this half term after listening to one of his stories.

Year 4: <u>Rosa Parks</u>. She stood up for the rights of the black community in America.

Year 5: <u>Tom Rutter</u>, He is an ex pupil, now in year 9. He is a javelin thrower and on track for representing England at a future Olympics.

Year 6: <u>Yinka Shonibare</u>. He is as an inspirational artist linked to our work this term with migration and transition.

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Growth Mindset Assembly



Today, we had a whole school assembly focused on promoting growth mindsets. The assembly was presented live from America and the presenters used a combination of magic and yo yo tricks to engage and excite the children. 
