Transition to new classes

Yesterday, we sent home information for parents and carers about the staffing arrangements for September 2021. We hope that you have managed to look at this so that you know who your child's class teacher and teaching assistant will be and which new classroom they will be in. We have had to make some changes to where classes will be and have taken into account the number of children in each class as well as the age of the children.

Today, we started our transition programme so that the children in Year 1 to Year 5 can start to get to know their new teacher and teaching assistant. After assembly this morning, the children met their new teacher and teaching assistant on the field for a 45mins session. Teachers used this time to read a story and play some circle time times with them. Children in Year 6 will be focusing on transitional work too but this will be in class with Mrs Duston. Pre-school and Nursery children's transition activities have been arranged for the week beginning 12th July and parents will have received information about these sessions already.

This week, we were delighted that all of the KS2 classes got to have the opportunity to go to Woodhall Estate for an outdoor educational day within their bubbles. Head Teacher's Awards

This week, I have met with some children who are applying the school learning values to their work in class.

In Nursery - Elizabeth was nominated for resilience and positive attitude towards her learning.

In Year 2 - Isabelle for her excellent writing about the Fire of London. She really was working to the best of her ability and achieving her full potential.

Big Question Fortnight is one of our newest initiatives in school this term. We are encouraging children to think about the world around them by asking questions about what they see, hear and experience. Open-ended questions have no right or wrong answers, but help to broaden children's thinking processes, to develop their speech and language skills, and to build confidence in their ability to express themselves using words. We also want to encourage children to think deeply about questions posed to them and to really listen to other children's thoughts and ideas. Ask your children about their classes big questions and how they responded to the question in class.

Big Question Fortnight

Here are the Big Questions that teachers will be exploring with their classes in the next couple of weeks.

Reception: Who am I, where do I belong?

Year 1: How do we define 'happiness' for ourselves and how important is it in our lives?

Year 2: Do you think musicians are born talented?

Year 3: If you witnessed someone commit a crime for a justifiably moral reason, would you punish them? If not, why not? If so, how?

Year 4: How did the Romans change Britain? What do you think was the most significant change?

Year 5: How do different cultures shape our definitions of right and wrong?

Year 6: What, in your opinion, is the ultimate point of art and why do you feel this way?




