This month's school learning value is Curiosity

Every month, as a school, we focus on one of the school learning values which are at the core of everything we do. They underpin our teaching and learning, and provide an environment which prepares our pupils as confident, happy citizens.

This month we are focusing specifically on 'Curiosity'. The more curious a child is, the more they will learn. Nurturing your child's curiosity is one of the most important ways you can help them become a lifelong learner.

Tips for Nurturing Curiosity

- 1. Model interest in the world around you. If you show an interest, then so will they.
- 2. Follow your child's lead and encourage their natural interests.
- 3. Answer questions simply and clearly and according to your child's development.
- 4. Use the library or internet to encourage the children to develop their curiosity. It doesn't matter whether children are reading about rockets or animals, the key is that their interest is captured and that they like to read.
- 5. Stimulate your child with open-ended questions. These are questions that don't have a right or wrong response, and can't be answered with only one word like "yes" or "no". "What was (such and such experience) like for you....", "Tell me about what happened in school today." These kinds of questions encourage your child to develop his thoughts and ideas, shows love and interest, and will give you a window into his inner life.
