## RSE Curriculum - Changing Me

During this half term there will be 2 or 3 age appropriate lessons to help children understand the changes that puberty (PSHE/RSE) brings and how human reproduction happens (taught in Science). We will also cover how to help pupils develop feelings of self-respect, confidence and empathy and create a positive culture around issues of sexuality and relationships. The younger year groups are not looking at these issues directly and explicitly but rather, learning correct terminology for body parts and doing the foundation work for later year groups. The Year 5 and 6 lessons look more carefully at puberty and human reproduction (Science.) This work is vitally important for children, as change of any kind can bring uncertainty. A letter has been sent via Marvellous me explaining what each year group will be covering. Please contact your class teacher if you require any further information.

### Summer Holiday Club

Over the half term holiday, Super Star Sports ran the holiday club for 3 days as a trial. We have had lots of positive feedback about this club and have been asked if we would like to host a summer holiday club too. We have agreed for the club to run for the first three weeks of the summer holiday (25th July - 12th August) and the cost per day will be £22 (or £100 for the full week). If, however, you would like extended childcare, then Super Star Sports have agreed to an earlier starting time of 8am and a later collection time of 5pm. We hope that this supports more working parents who require childcare during the summer holiday. There will be additional costs involved for the early drop off and later collection times (more details to follow).

Unfortunately, they are unable to run the club for the full 6 weeks but I have been reassured that another club will be running in a venue for the last 3 weeks of the holiday fairly nearby.

However, this club will only run in the summer holidays if there is enough interest and enough children are signed up to attend daily to make it a financially viable venture for the sports club.
