

Newsletter 1st July 2022



To all our families and friends,

All of the children have become geographers this week and taken part in a variety of different fieldwork experiences, many of which were off site and in the local village. These opportunities have enabled the children to gain a broader range of skills which are difficult to develop in the classroom alone. It also provided a 'real world' opportunity to extend children's geographical thinking too. It has been a hugely successful event which we look forward to repeating this again next year. Thanks to all the teachers for providing such rich opportunities and to Mr Ring for coordinating this event across the school.

This week in Nursery we have been looking at the story of 'We're going on a bear hunt'. The children have been retelling the story with actions, making maps of the journey in the book or a journey they have been on before and going to forest school for our own bear hunt!

Year 1 - We wanted to find out which part of the playground was the most popular during break. Each group observed a different area of the playground. The areas we observed were: field, tyres, sheltered area, bus, boat, trim trail, stage and house. We recorded our data on a tally chart and then we had a discussion about it.

Year 3 - We started by exploring forest school. This is a very natural environment but it has been modified by humans with log benches and fires. The next part of exploring was the playground. We looked at how the buildings, playground and concrete impacted on wildlife.

In Year 5, we have linked our Fieldwork with our Young Leaders Award. We identified a part of the village that needed clearing and set up a campaign to improve the area. In our English lessons, we have written letters, speeches and created posters and we even went out with litter pickers on Tuesday. To conclude our fieldwork, we evaluated our findings and used them to plan the next stage of our campaign.

This week in Reception we have mapped the classroom. We used photos and then drew landmarks and placed them correctly on the map. We then used a Beebot to travel around the 'classroom'.

Year 2 - On Wednesday walked along the High Street and took photographs of the businesses and buildings. We then used our photographs to plot and create our own maps of the High Street.

To finish the week, we used our maps and trip experience to compare Watton-At-Stone High Street to pictures of a street in Kenya.

The focus of Year 4's geography fieldwork was transport. The question that we were exploring was: Is traffic a problem in Watton at Stone village? We walked to Watton High Street to carry out a traffic survey to see what types of vehicles and how many pass along the High Street within a given time. We also observed what was happening in terms of the traffic flow. We used our maths skills to create a bar chart and then we discussed our findings.

Year 6 have been investigating TRADE. Previously in class we have studied Global Trade and so we followed this up with fieldwork in our village. We visited Bridget B's where we received a warm welcome as we discovered where the meat that they sell comes from. We explored the range of foods sold at Budgens - if we ever fancy purchasing a £450 bottle of champagne we now know where to go!

We are aware that some children will require further enhanced transition work also and we have planned for these children to make a transition book with Mrs Bell before the end of term as well as spending time to look through the book, go back to their new class and meet the teacher with their current class teaching assistant.





In the story, Isabella sifts through Great Granny Joyce's treasure box of souvenirs, which act as introductions to the contents of the book. These include recent and historical events across the United Kingdom and Commonwealth, inspirational people, landmark innovations and inventions, and a selection of the best art, design, and culture.

The book will also include famous quotes from the Queen, facts on the coronation ceremony, content on the lives of famous Commonwealth figures such as Nelson Mandela, notable kings and queens and a timeline of Queen Elizabeth's life.
