# Geography - Orienteering

During our lessons in orienteering, we have learnt to read maps. This could be the map of a face or key symbols that appear on a map. Making silly faces was the fun element finding a piece of equipment to represent a mouth or an eye. Some of the faces did not quite look how they should, but the children enjoyed making them.



Some of the classes have moved onto looking at symbols that would appear on a map and matching them to the words. They found this harder as some symbols did not look like the words. The children are finding these lessons enjoyable as they're competing against their peers each time.

#### Increase in scarlet fever cases

There continues to be a national increase in notifications of scarlet fever and iGAS (invasive group A streptococcal) to the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA), and that these notifications are currently above the seasonal expected levels.

Signs and Symptoms of Scarlet Fever

Scarlet fever is a common childhood infection caused by Streptococcus pyogenes, or group A streptococcus (GAS). The early symptoms of scarlet fever include sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. After 12 to 48 hours the characteristic red, pinhead rash develops, typically first appearing on the chest and stomach, then rapidly spreading to other parts of the body, and giving the skin a sandpaper-like texture. The scarlet rash may be harder to spot on darker skin, although the 'sandpaper' feel should be present. Patients typically have flushed cheeks and pallor around the mouth. This may be accompanied by a 'strawberry tongue'. As the child improves peeling of the skin can occur. Although scarlet fever is usually a mild illness, patients can develop complications so if you have any concerns please contact your local
