To all our families and friends,

This week has been an exceptionally busy week for everyone in school.

On Monday, we held a very special Remembrance assembly which was led by Reverend Jenny. She talked past and present wars and some of the lives that were lost. The children heard the Last Post played and listened to the National Anthem. Two of the children in Year 6 also read some thoughtful and poignant poems to mark this occasion and all of the children sang a song called 'We Will Remember the Soldiers Once More' that they have been learning in their weekly singing assembly recently.

We have welcomed prospective parents to tour the school before they make their primary school applications. We are always incredibly proud to talk to parents and tour them around the school as we know that we offer amazing facilities, curriculum and extra-curricular activities. We also hosted a parent meeting on Tuesday morning for parents who have children in Pre-School and Nursery classes all about promoting a love of reading. A huge thank you to the many parents who attended. We hope that you found the session to be useful. The PowerPoint shared during the session has now been saved on the Pre-School and Nursery class pages on the school website. Finally, we welcomed Year 5 parents and families this morning, as they came to watch the Year 5 class assembly. The children showcased many of the lessons they have had across the curriculum during this term which included a whole class song, creative arts dance and portrait drawings. The children spoke with confidence and performed with enthusiasm. Well done Year 5.

On Wednesday, we held our first Pupil Parliament meeting of the school year. The Pupil Parliament involves all children from Reception to Year 6 and the meetings are led by the Year 6 children and supported by a member of staff. In this meeting we informed the children what changes had taken place since the last Pupil Parliament meeting back in the summer term. These changes included creating a gardening area which will now be designed by the children. The garden will be near the decking area so that it is accessible during all seasons. It will be designed by the children and maintained by them too!! The children also wanted another House competition. Working with the House and Vice House captains, 3 possible competitions were chosen and in the pupil parliament meeting, the children took a democratic vote to choose the competition that we will be organising. Parent Forum Meeting

On Tuesday evening, I met with the class parent reps for our termly Parent Forum Meeting. We welcomed back some parents who were class reps last year as well as welcoming new reps who are joining the Parent Forum group this year. For the first time in 2 years, it was wonderful to be able to hold this meeting in person, instead of virtually. A cup of tea and biscuit in person whilst having a chat always makes these events more pleasurable! Having not met the parent forum group since May 2022, there was lots to talk about and it's great that parents are providing the reps with points of discussion that you would like us to discuss. If you are unsure who your class reps is, then we have lots of information on our parent forum page of the website, alongside email addresses for you so that you can contact your class rep. I am also aware that most year groups have a WhatsApp group too where points of discussion are raised. If, however, your concern is urgent, then please don't hesitate to speak to myself of a member of staff at school instead of waiting for parent forum meetings to take place. Reverse Advent Calendar

Raising a concern with the school

We work hard to maintain good relationships with our children and parents but sometimes parents need to raise a concern or even complain formally about issues relating to a matter at the school.

In the first instance, please raise your concern to the class teacher as they are often best placed to solve your concerns immediately.

If, however, you are unhappy with the class teacher's response, then you can raise your concern in writing with one of the phase leaders (Miss Chatman, Mrs Gill, Mrs Roberts and Mrs Higgins). They will investigate your concerns and provide you with a response.

If you are still unhappy with the response you are given, then you can escalate your concern again in writing to the Deputy Head (Mrs Gill).

Finally, should you be dissatisfied with the response from the Deputy Head, then you can raise your concern in writing with Mrs Etienne.

Breakfast Club

As we published at the end of September, our breakfast club numbers are currently exceptionally low and as school we have had to reduce staffing hours to enable this club to continue. Whereas we would prefer parents to make regular bookings with us, we are also happy to take ad hoc bookings when you know that there will be a specific day that you will require your child to come to breakfast club to support your childcare arrangements.






