## Newsletter 18th November 2022



To all our families and friends,

This week, we started our Wellbeing and Anti Bullying week by all wearing odd socks to school. The odd socks symbolises that we are all different and that children should all be allowed to be themselves, accepting of one another and celebrate difference.







During the week, all the classes took part in at least one wellbeing/anti bullying activity each day. All teachers were asked to complete an anti-bullying questionnaire with their classes too. We will share the results of the whole school questionnaire in a few weeks' time when they have been analysed.

To support your conversations at home, it may be useful for you to use a similar definition of bullying that we use in school:

**Bullying** is an ongoing and deliberate misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that intends to cause physical, social and/or psychological harm.

#### Bullying is not:

- \*Not liking someone
- \*Accidentally bumping into someone
- \*Making other children play things a certain way
- \*A single act of telling a joke about someone
- \*Arguments with other children.
- \*Expression of unpleasant thoughts or feelings regarding others
- \*Isolated acts of harassment, aggressive behaviour, intimidation or meanness

All the behaviours above are unpleasant and need to be addressed, but they are not to be treated as bullying. Many times, labelling a single act of aggression can turn it into bullying just by perceiving it that way.

We finished the week with an amazing sharing assembly which showcased all the classes learning this week.

## Persistent absentees

As a school we work hard to reduce our persistent absence levels. We monitor all absences thoroughly on a weekly basis and send out letters to parents and carers where a child has been taken out of school for a term time holiday or where we are concerned about a child missing many days of their education. If we see no improvement in attendance, we then invite those parents and carers of our persistently absent children into school for a meeting with the Headteacher and Attendance Officer.

A child becomes a persistent absentee when they miss 10% of the school days for whatever reason. It may shock many parents to know that children reach this benchmark at the end of the autumn term if they have missed 4.5 days of school this term (which is equivalent to 9 absences).

As a school we know the benefits of regular attendance for the children's learning and that those children who are persistently absent are at risk of not reaching their full potential. We want to work with all of our parents and carers and support you in getting your child to attend school as much as possible. We will be sending out letters to parents shortly where we have identified children as being persistent absentees.

## Balanceability

This week, Reception class have taken part in Balanceability lessons. Balanceability is a national initiative designed to teach young children the skills to ride a pedal bicycle. The Hertford and Ware sports Partnership has a number of unique ergonomic balance bikes - bikes with no pedals or little bikes, as we like to call them and can offer children the chance to acquire the initial skills to enable them to progress to riding a pedal bike.

Their Balanceability programme comprises of structured lesson plans that help children develop gross motor skills, spatial awareness, dynamic and static balance, bilateral coordination and confidence in a safe, challenging but fun way.

## Year 3 - Making Stone Soup








## LETS MAKE SWEET POTATO



## WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- · 2 sweet potatoes (cooked, peeled and mashed)
- 2 tbsp maple syrup 240g plain flour
- 2tsp baking powder
- Pinch of salt
- 50g soft brown sugar
- 4 tsp cinnamon
- 50g icing sugar
- 1-2tsp water


## CINNAMON SWIRLS!



- 3. Mash the potatoes and stir through the maple syrup
- 4. Mix the flour, baking powder, bicarbonate of soda and salt together.
- 5. Add in the flour mix to the mashed potato a little bit at a time, stirring until it becomes a ball. You might need to use your hands to bring it all together to form a dough.
- 6. Allow the dough to rest for at least 30 minutes
- 7. Using a rolling pin or your hands, roll out the dough onto a floured surface to make a rectangle. It should bethe thickness of a £1 coin
- 8. Lightly brush the surface with the oil
- 9. Mix the sugar and cinnamon together and sprinkle across the surface
- 10. Using a pizza cutter or a knife, cut 3cm strips and then 1/4 tsp bicarbonate of soda roll them to make a spiral
  - 11. Put all the rolls next to each other in an oven dish and bake for 30 minutes
- 12. Meanwhile, mix icing sugar together with a little bit of • 1 tbsp vegetable or olive oil water to make a thick paste.
  - 13. Drizzle over the buns once they're cooled
