To all our families and friends

I am delighted to inform you that the final Ofsted inspection report from our two-day section 8 inspection on 13th and 14th March accompanies this newsletter. The report will also be accessible via the school website from today and published on the official Ofsted report website in a few days' time. The purpose of a section 8 inspection is to gauge whether a school continues to be 'good' as indicated in our previous report in July 2017.

It gives me great pleasure to share that Her Majesty's Inspector judged Watton at Stone Primary school as a Good school.

I am delighted that the hard work undertaken by the staff and Governors has been recognised, including the comments regarding our high expectations for behaviour and learning, the support offered to pupils with SEND, safeguarding, the provision for the children in the early years, how the school deals effectively with bullying, the wider range of extra curricular clubs offered and the progress that we have made in the last 3 years to develop a strong curriculum (even though we are still currently on this journey). The report itself highlights the many elements of effective provision at our school as well as 2 next steps needed to take the school forward. What is very satisfying is that the next steps identified were already within our development plan prior to this inspection and the associated adaptations are already being implemented. I am passionate about not only Watton being a good school but one that continuously strives to improve and excel.



Message from the School Governors

The Governors are delighted that Ofsted have judged that our school continues to be a good school. The report recognises the impact of the hard work and dedication we see from all members of staff and the positive impact this has had on the school's pupils. We remain extremely grateful for Mrs Etienne's leadership and drive to improve the school, and that all members of staff work together so that the children can achieve their potential. It is important to note however that the hard work doesn't stop here. The staff and Governors will continue to strive to improve the school - the areas for improvement identified by the Inspector are matters that the school had already begun working on. Absence from School


We recognise that children do get ill and there are certainly plenty of bugs and viruses around at the moment. However, if your child is only slightly under the weather or has a cold, please do send them into school unless they are really unwell and unfit for school.

When a child is absent from school, they miss out on their learning and shared experiences with friends which means that when they return to school they may feel left out and will not have the 'background learning' for tasks. Research suggests that pupils who have an average of 20 days absence per school year see negative results throughout their education journey- resulting in a whole GCSE deficit by the time they leave secondary education. Obviously, we are not advocating sending poorly children into school, but we are asking you to be mindful about whether your child really does need to stay at home and the impact on their learning and social well-being in doing so. If your child is not well enough to attend school, please contact the school office with an explanation for the absence before 9.30am for each day of absence (unless your child has diarrhea and vomiting which requires children to be off school for 48 hours).
