Intervention Information

The purpose of these interventions is to support a pupil to catch up but we do try and minimise how many interventions take place in each class so that the children don't miss out on other lessons across the curriculum. Sponsored Bounce Fundraiser

A massive thank you to everyone who has supported our most recent whole school fundraiser. We have been amazed by the amount that the sponsored bounce raised and the generosity of our parents and families. To date, we have raised a total of £3,800!!!! This money will be used to fund music and science workshops for children in KS1/KS2, a special early years event as well as the panto at Christmas time. Every child who brought in their sponsorship money, no matter how much they raised, will receive a certificate for their efforts. We will be awarding these certificates next week so please do bring in any outstanding money by the beginning of next week to ensure that you child gets their certificate. We will also be looking to award prizes for the children in each key stage who have personally raised the most money and look forward to sharing this with you next week.

Walk To School Week

Our school is taking part in Walk to School Week (15-19 May). The nationwide event is organised by walking charity Living Streets and designed to help pupils experience first-hand the importance of walking to school. Children will be well on their way to reaching their recommended minimum 60 minutes of physical activity per day before even reaching the school gates! Not only will it set them up for a positive day in the classroom, but it will also help create healthy habits for life.

This year's challenge, Walk with Wildlife, encourages children to travel actively to school every day of the week. Meeting various animals along the way, they'll learn about the important reasons to walk and the difference it can make for individuals, communities and the planet!

Each pupil will be challenged to travel sustainably (walk, wheel, scoot, cycle or Park and Stride) to school every day for one week using the wallchart and stickers to log their journeys. Each class will work collectively to make as many active journeys to school as possible across the week. Individual activity diaries, daily stickers and end of week pupil rewards will complement this activity, reinforcing the benefits and keeping children engaged.

Please can you make arrangements so that your child/children can travel actively to school on the week commencing 15th May, helping our school reduce congestion and pollution around the school gates. In return, your child will earn special stickers and a reward trophy! Walking, wheeling, scooting and cycling all count! If you live far away from school and need to drive or take public transport, try parking the car or hopping off the bus/train ten minutes away and walking the rest of the journey. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

<u>Sun cream</u>

As we move into the summer term, there will hopefully be some warmer and sunnier days to enjoy. With this in mind, there may be days where the temperatures are high and therefore you are advised to apply sun cream to your child before the start of the school day. Unfortunately, staff at the school are not able to apply sun cream to the children ourselves due to our safeguarding practices as well as this also being incredibly time consuming when all children have brought in their own bottles of sun cream to be applied. If your child is in KS1 or KS2 and is able to apply the sun cream themselves, then they may bring in a bottle to keep in their school bag and they can apply it themselves if required. However, please don't send children in Nursery or Reception to school with sun cream as they are too young to apply this properly on their own. As a school, we do monitor the amount of time children are exposed to the sun and high temperatures so that they don't burn. However, this is most effective when children have been applied with sun cream before the start of the school day. Thank you for your support.
