To all our families and friends,

As a school, we are committed to continuing to raise awareness for all about mental health as well as supporting individual children who are currently suffering with poor mental health. This week we have continued to educate the children in class and assembly, promote strategies which help to improve mental health and delivered staff training too. Being outdoors and active is just one way of supporting positive mental health and this week, we have encouraged the children to walk to school everyday as part of the Living Streets 'Walk with Wildlife' incentive. Well done to everyone who managed to walk part or some of the way to school everyday. Being in the fresh air, getting active and talking to your child whilst walking, is such a great way to start the day, whilst supporting yours and their physical and mental health. A huge thank you to Jess Bentley (a school governor) who came in to school today to lead 'Sound Bath' workshops with children in Years 1 - 6. This is a meditative experience where you are 'bathed' in sound waves. This is often used to reduce anxiety and manage stress.

On Tuesday afternoon, children in KS2 had the opportunity to take part in inter house netball and football matches. The winners of the netball competition were the Blue team, Yellow came second, Red third and Green fourth. In the football, Green team won, Yellow came second, Blue were third and Red fourth. We have recently set up a friendship bench on the playground as a way for children to signal to others that they are feeling lonely and need a friend to play with or someone to talk to. The bench allows other children on the playground to clearly see when another child needs support or a friend, and they can join them on the bench for a chat or invite them to play.



This year, we are due to be open for 189 days which equates to 378 sessions with registration in the morning at 08:50 and after lunch in the afternoon. Attendance is affected if a pupil is not present at school for any whole session including registration. The class with the best attendance each week will win the Attendance trophy to keep in class until the following Friday.



# Police Community Support Officer Visit (P.C.S.O)


On Thursday afternoon, we invited 2 Police Community Support Officers to come into school and talk to the children in Years 5 and 6 about internet safety.

We have had concerns this year about some of the older children's online interactions with others and despite lots of education taking place in school, this continues to be an issue for some children. The P.C.S.O's focused their question and discussion session on how children should be keeping themselves safe online, how all written comments and messages can never be permanently deleted and how the age for criminal responsibility in England is 10 years of age. This promoted lots of questions from the children and many of them demonstrated an excellent knowledge of online safety in theory, even though we know that this isn't always carried out in practice. The children were informed how it is not legal to use many of the apps that they currently have on their phone. This includes apps such as:
